Important Parent Reminders

Thornhill Academy want to make communication with you easy and ensure that you never miss an important message about your child's education. We would like to thank the parents/carers who have already signed up and encourage anyone who has not done this yet, to do so.

There are some easy steps that you can follow to help us achieve this:

- Ensure that we have up to date contact details for you and all emergency contacts.
- Sign up for the school Parent App – if you have not registered yet and need an activation code, please contact the main school office, and then simply download the free SIMS Parent App through Apple store or Google Play store.
- Log into Class Charts to follow your child's progress, view timetables, review behaviour and communicate with school staff.
- Use ParentPay as a way of adding funds to your child's lunch account, pay for school events and trips, etc. This is the safest and quickest way to make payment to the school and helps us move towards our goal of being a totally cashless site.
- Log into the website frequently to see the latest news from [Thornhill Academy](#)
- Follow the website link to add your details to the Free School Meals portal. Even if you are not currently entitled by registering with the portal we will automatically be notified if due to a change in your circumstances your child becomes entitled to Free School Meals [Free School Meals portal](#)

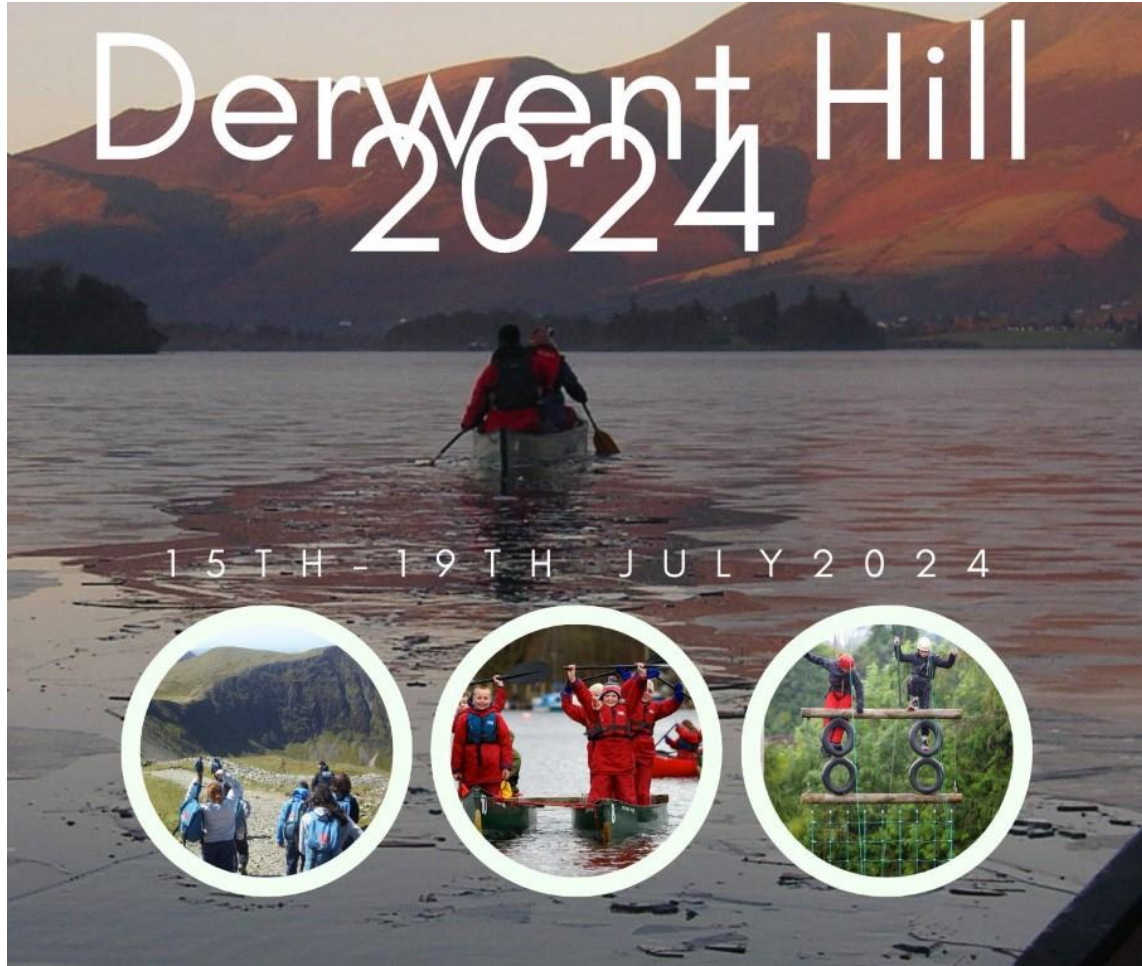
School Nurse Drop ins

Year 11 Attendance

Year 11 exams are well underway, and it has been fantastic to see so many of our young people engaging in the additional revision and booster sessions. Whilst the exam season has started, there are still courses where students have not finished their coursework. It is essential that Year 11 students are in school each day, to ensure that they get the opportunity to complete all their work to the best possible standard. In lesson time, staff are able to share their expertise, and guide student's revision in the lead up to the exams. The best place year 11 can be, at the moment, is in school.

Assemblies

This week's assembly had a focus on mental health awareness, particularly focusing on the early signs of stress, and how this may look in school aged children - there was then a number of techniques shared with children, on how to manage stress in a healthy way, both in school and at home. The assembly re-signposted the pastoral team, and the importance of pupils speaking to school staff if they do feel overwhelmed in school

Standards and Expectations

As we approach half term, we would like to ensure that we maintain the highest possible standards and expectations for all of our young people. Whilst the large majority of students wear their uniform with pride and attend school in the correct school uniform each day, we would like to outline our expectations so that is clear for all parents/carers.

Black Blazer embroidered		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Replacement of the blazer with an alternative jacket, hoody or tracksuit top is not allowed.
Formal white school shirt - to be tucked in		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> This is not a polo shirt.
School maroon and silver striped clip-on tie		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The tie must be worn at all times.
Black V Neck Jumper (ONLY)		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Round neck sweatshirts are not an alternative. The wearing of the jumper does not replace the wearing of the blazer.
Black school shoes – Leather type		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Footwear must be 100% black with no logos. No trainers or canvas material.
Dark coloured Waterproof Coat (ONLY)		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> No hoodies, tracksuit tops, sweatshirts, denim jackets. Not to be worn under the blazer. Not to be worn inside of the building. Non-uniform items will be confiscated.
Black Tights	or Black/White Socks	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> No patterned tights.
Formal Black Trousers	or Black Charleston skirt	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Skirts must be a Black Charleston style skirt with a flat upper section and pleated lower section. Short 'tube' type designs are not acceptable. Trousers must not be denim, jeans, or jean style. No leggings are allowed.
Important information to also note:		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> No excessive or heavy make-up. Short, neutral-coloured nails only. Baseball caps are banned, and other hats/hoods must not be worn inside the buildings. Jewellery which can be worn, is a single pair of stud earrings and a wristwatch. This will be confiscated if worn. No extreme haircuts, lines, or shading. Mobile phones are not permitted and will be confiscated if seen or heard.
