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Dear Parent / carer and pupil

Since returning to school last Wednesday and Thursday all staff have commented on how well our pupils have adapted to our new operations and protocols. Pupils have faced a number of 'new' systems and instructions and they have treated the whole situation with the importance it requires.

This work will be prefixed with ICA (in case of absence) and is additional to the regular homework set by pupils' subject teachers.
