Enterprise Co-Curricular

Students from year 7-10 have made a great start to their Young Enterprise Company programme. We have also recruited 18 students to be part of our Social Enterprise group. Students took part in their first workshop this week,

This is the first year the Social Enterprise Academy programme has run outside of London, and we are privileged to be chosen to take part.



In our first session this week, students explored a range of ideas for supporting our local, national, and even international communities. Clare from the Social Enterprise Academy was very impressed with our students from Year 7 and Year 10. Our next session will help to firm up the students' ideas to enable them to begin raising funds to improve the lives of others.

Financial Awareness Week

We have had a range of different finance related activities for all year groups this week. Our students fed-back to us that they wanted more education on finance, and especially how this can affect decisions for their future. Because of this, as a school, we are growing our financial education programmes within the school and kick starting this with our first Financial Awareness Week!

On Monday, students worked with their tutors to explore a range of different aspects of finance.





Year 7 followed the positive **footprints** looking at budgeting and cost of living.

Year 8 and 9 explored HMRC Tax Facts and what happens to our money!

Year 10 started the ECOMONE programme, where they looked at the full infrastructure of finance, from the bank of England to small businesses- this will be continued in guidance lessons next term

Year 11 explored payslips, and how tax and NI contributions are calculated, getting ready for their first jobs!



On Thursday we welcomed in visitors from The Personal Fnance Skills organisation, to work with Year 7 and Year 10. Year 7 learned how to open their first bank account and all of the considerations associated with this, including credit scores. Thank you to Malcom from Foster Denovo financial advisors for delivering this session.





Year 10 learned more about moving on from school, looking at tax and NI deductions, payslips and calculating earnings. Thank you to Sam from Newcastle Building Society for delivering this informative session.

Finally, we ended the week with engaging workshops

Year 7 and Year 8 became Fraud Scene Investigators, looking at how they can keep themselves, and their finances secure!

Year 9 and Year 10 explored how they can get involved with 'Making a Difference' and designing social enterprise projects.



National Science Week

Thanks to the Platton Family Fund, year 8 experienced a STEM workshop with the Smallpiece Trust, as part of National Science Week. Students designed and constructed a wind turbine, to produce the greatest amount of electricity. They produced a gearing system, designed and constructed turbine blades, all to maximise output. They even created a tower to carry the turbine! At the end of the day, students presented back to the whole group their designs, and Mr Miller, our DT and engineering teacher judged the winners!

Following on from National Careers Week, our students continued to gain a wide range of career related experiences with our Inspiration Day! On this day the timetable was collapsed, and many organisations joined us to deliver inspiring careers sessions to all year groups, from a range of different sectors. 
Year 7 had a carousel of 'Careers in...' sessions linking their curriculum learning to future careers and skills. A highlight was working with the Royal Air Force to evaluate emergency scenarios and plan what actions, jobs and roles would be needed.











Year 8 also explored 'Careers in...' sessions alongside an interactive session with Penshaw View learning about health and safety at work.

Students also developed their team building skills with a tetrahedron activity with Equans,, lots of fun whilst learning about the construction industry.

Year 9 gained an insight into careers in energy with Northern Gas Networks and the world of audio equipment and broadcasting with Canford.







Year 10 engineering students visited the Wates construction site, before returning to school to take part in our sessions with the Department of Work and Pensions. Here students explored employability and teambuilding skills and gained mock interview practice. We were very impressed with the feedback from our visitors who interviewed our students and look forward to sharing this with the students soon.







Year 11 students were involved in sessions with the National Citizens Service. They had a great boost in the middle of a day of intervention and exam preparation, with a high energy presentation about the NCS opportunities in the summer. Great to hear so many students have signed up already.
